WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue has met and considered its budget for calendar year 2002; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue attest that the population of Fire Protection District 5 is less than 10,000; and

WHEREAS, Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue has more than one full-time paid employee; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue, in the course of considering the budget for 2002 has reviewed all sources of revenue and examined all anticipated expenses and obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue has reviewed the Island County Assessor's calculations of the allowable taxes, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue, has determined that due to continued growth, increasing calls for service, continued capital works projects, and new unfunded mandated regulations involving firefighter safety, equipment, and training, the Board of Fire Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue finds that there is a substantial need to increase the regular property tax levy above the implicit price deflator (IPD).


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Central Whidbey Island Fire and Rescue that the limit factor for the regular property tax levy, in addition to the increase resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property and any increase in value of state-assessed property, is here by authorized for year 2002, to levy in the amount of 1,067,076.48 which is a percentage increase of six (6) percent from the highest amount of regular property taxes that could have been lawfully levied in this taxing district in any previous year since 1985. This figure represents all or a portion of the Fire District's "Banked Levy Capacity."
