1. Commissioner Cheryl Engle moved to approve and Commissioner Paul Messner seconded motion #1 to declare Apparatus 1502 (Marine 5) surplus.

2. Commissioner Paul Messner mover to approve and Commissioner Cheryl Engle seconded Motion #2 to the purchase order 60-1011-000` for purchase of a 27' rescue boat from Life Proof Boats of Bremerton, Washington in the amount of \$353,370.29.

Action: Approved Unanimously.

 Commissioner Paul Messner mover to approve and Commissioner Cheryl Engle seconded Motion #3 Declaring Apparatus 9401 (former Engine 51), 9601 (former Engine 512) and 9602 (former Engine 54)

Action: Approved Unanimously.

4. Commissioner Cheryl Engle moved to approve and Commissioner Paul Messner seconded motion #4 creation of the classification of division chief (i.e., reclassification of the position of training and recruitment captain).

Action: Approved Unanimously.

5. Chief Hartin lead the discussion of short to mid-term economic and financial challenges.

Like all businesses, governments, and individuals, the district is faced with increasing inflation which will undoubtedly impact construction cost for the new Station 53. Due to repeated delay in the permitting process since passing a voter approved bond for this project in 2017, prices are anticipated to be considerably higher, with total cost possibly exceeding currently available funds. This may necessitate additional financing such as a councilmatic bond to provide sufficient funds for project completion. The exact impact of inflation will be determined when the district goes out to bid (planned for April).

A second potential challenge is the current financial condition of the Whidbey Island Public Hospital District. It is unknown how the financial condition of the hospital will impact the district's interlocal agreement to staff a BLS ambulance, but this agreement provides the district's second largest revenue stream (\$280,000). Impact to this revenue stream would have a serious impact on the district's ability to maintain current service delivery levels.

The Fire Commissioners went into Executive Session at 5:45 for 20 minutes ending at 6:10 pm to review personnel matters in accordance with RCW 42.30.110(1)(f). The Fire Commissioners ended their Executive Session with no decision being made.

 Commissioner Cheryl Engle moved to approve and Commissioner Paul Messner seconded motion #5 memorandum of understanding between the district and Local 4299 International Association of Firefighters regarding the grievance file by the local on behalf of Firefighter Derik Vrable.

Action: Approved Unanimously.
